THE 56<sup>TH</sup> BEDFORD PARK FESTIVAL



The Bedford Park Festival (including  
its opening Green Days weekend)  
is one of London's best-loved arts  
and community events, attracting  
thousands of people of all ages. It  
involves many local artists, musicians  
and performers, professional and  
amateur and, with almost 30 events  
in two weeks, there is something

for everyone, and people of all ages - art, crafts, photography,  
music, five-a-side football, poetry, talks, walks and children's and  
community events.

The Festival was established in 1967 by St Michael & All  
Angels Church, with the support of the Bedford Park Society,  
to celebrate the arts, raise money for repairs to the church and  
'foster a spirit of friendliness and community.' Its first patron,  
the poet and heritage campaigner John Betjeman described  
Bedford Park as 'the most significant suburb built in the last  
century, probably the most significant in the Western world'.  
That first Festival helped save 356 Arts & Crafts houses from the  
threat of demolition by developers, and Bedford Park is now part  
of two conservation areas.

More than 50 years on, the Festival is still true to the spirit in  
which it was established. It raises money for St Michael & All  
Angels and its three chosen charities: The Upper Room, which  
provides food, counselling and essential support to homeless  
people and ex-offenders in our local community; West London  
Welcome, established to support refugees arriving in West  
London; and our new charity, Swinfen Telemedicine, which helps  
medical professionals working in some of the most deprived  
communities on the planet to access leading specialists across  
the UK, Europe & North America
