

WELCOME TO ST MICHAEL'S

The Bedford Park Festival

Today the Bedford Park Festival culminates in this Mass of Thanksgiving, with chorus and orchestra. The church has organised the Festival since 1967 and which usually consists of two days of church fete ("Green Days") and a fortnight's Arts Festival. Last year because of the pandemic, we managed to produce some events on-line, but this year we rejoice that we have been able to organise events where people are able to be physically present.

The proceeds of the Festival will be divided between the church and three charities: West London Welcome supporting refugees, asylum seekers and migrants who have settled in West London; the Upper Room, a centre for the homeless and disadvantaged in West London; and Water Harvest, bringing clean water to poorer communities in Rajasthan.

Missa Sancti Nicolai, Mass no 6 in G

The St Nicholas Mass was one of the few choral works that Haydn wrote before he was fifty. It seems likely that it was written to celebrate the name day of his employer, Prince Nicolaus Esterhazy, on 6th December 1772. While it is not on the same scale as his later Masses, it is full of Haydn's quintessential energy, tunefulness, and infectious joy.

Let us proclaim the Mystery of Faith

And so, Father, calling to mind His death on the Cross, His perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in His mighty Resurrection and glorious Ascension, and looking for His coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this Bread and this Cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your Kingdom all who share this one Bread and one Cup, so that we, in the company of the Blessèd Virgin Mary, St Joseph, St Michael the Archangel, St Peter, St Paul and all the Holy Angels and Saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**
