The 60th Bedford Park Festival & Green Days Fête



The Bedford Park Festival (including its opening Green Days weekend) is one of London's best-loved arts and community events, attracting thousands of people of all ages. It involves many local artists, musicians and performers, professional and amateur. There is something for everyone, and people of all ages - art, crafts, photography, music, poetry, talks, walks and children's and community events.

The Festival was established in 1967 by the vicar of St Michael & All Angels Church, with the support of the Bedford Park Society, to celebrate the arts, raise money for repairs to the church and 'foster a spirit of friendliness and community.' Its first patron, the poet and heritage campaigner John Betjeman, described Bedford Park as 'the most significant suburb built in the last century, probably the most significant in the Western world'. That first Festival helped save 356 Arts & Crafts houses from the threat of demolition by developers, and Bedford Park is now part of two conservation areas.

60 years on, the Festival is true to the spirit in which it was established. It raises money for St Michael & All Angels Church and its chosen charities: **The Upper Room**, which provides support to homeless people and ex-offenders in our community; **The McCabe Educational Trust** which helps children in the Holy Land; **The Mulberry Centre**, which supports anyone affected by cancer; and the **St Michael & All Angels Trust** which gives grants to further the church's religious and pastoral work and supports the maintenance of the buildings

60 Years of the Bedford Park Festival & Green Days

The Bedford Park Festival was launched in 1967 by the vicar of St Michael & All Angels, Jack Jenner, and its appeal committee.

The Festival brought Bedford Park back to life, regenerating the artistic spirit in which it was built in the 1870s as the world's first garden suburb, under the celebrated architect, Richard Norman Shaw. It also helped John Betjeman win 'The Battle of Bedford Park' (picture below). The breakthrough came with an exhibition

staged in the Vicarage as part of the first Festival, highlighting the art and architecture of Bedford Park and the dangers it faced. One visitor was a Ministry of Housing inspector, who was so impressed that within a month he recommended the Grade II listing of 356 buildings, including the former Stores (now offices), the Tabard Inn, the Club (now the London Buddhist Vihara), the Church of St Michael and All Angels and its Parish Hall.

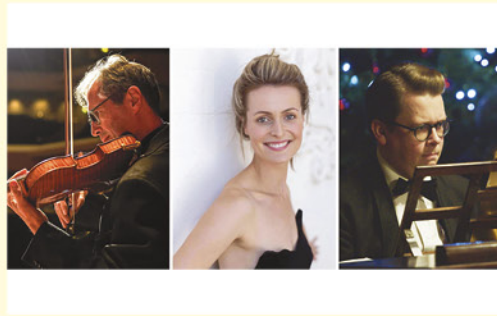

60 Years of the Bedford Park Festival & Green Days

Ever since the first Festival in 1967, concerts by local musicians and exhibitions by local artists have formed the backbone of the Festival, keeping alive the artistic spirit in which the world's first garden suburb was created 150 years ago.

Violinist David Juritz has performed in the Festival every year for almost 30 years, initially as leader of the London Mozart Players when he launched the Summer Serenade concerts here.

Soprano Milly Forrest began performing in St Michael & All Angels Church in 2003 at the age of 9, when she appeared in the Festival's children's musicals – as reported in the Evening Standard when she became a front-page

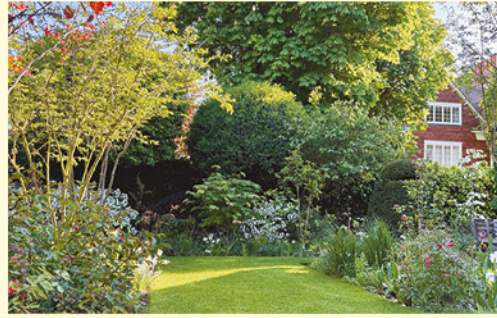
